



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

April 11, 2021 Second Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy) Acts of the Apostles 4:32-35 Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24 1 John 5: 1-6 John 20:19-31

A reading from the Gospel according to John:

the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you."

When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and

On the evening of that first day of the week, when

said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other

not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Happy and Blessed Easter. Jesus is Risen. Alleluia! They thought that they hadkilled Him. Then the Resurrection happened; Jesus rose from death on the third day. So they found out that Jesus, whom they killed, has killed death that they inflicted upon Him. Death could not terminate the force of Life; because Death was killed and Life became deathless and eternal.

As the Gospel stories of the Resurrection describe, no one witnessed the event of the Resurrection.


The first visitors, the group of women went to the tomb with spices to embalm the dead body of Jesus. They expected the dead body to be there in the tomb where He was buried on Good Friday. But they and all those who followed them to the tomb found an empty tomb. The angel in the empty tomb announced to them that Jesus is risen. No one saw the event of the Resurrection but all those who believed in the Resurrection saw the Risen Jesus who repeatedly appeared to them in various places at various times.



They soon realized in the following days that Resurrection is more an

experience of Jesus, the Risen person and not merely an event that happened to Him. Easter invites us to start with the empty tomb. Easter first starts with an event of Jesus rising from death; then Easter continues with great spiritual effect that Jesus makes on the force of the life of the believers. The real power of Easter consists in not merely establishing the fact that Jesus won over death. Jesus rose from death not merely to prove that no one can kill Him, nor to prove how wrong they were in putting Him to death.

Easter is God's will to empower life to be unaffected by death. Easter is a spiritual reality that the believers in Jesus can enter into a deathless life in Jesus who rose from death and lives among them



as eternal life, to share eternal life with them. Once more Jesus invites us all to read and realize what He said when He raised the dead Lazarus to life, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die" (John 11:25-26).

Easter opens all those tombs in which we are enslaved, locked or buried. Our Faith in Jesus gives us the courage to get buried with Jesus only to rise with the power of His Resurrection, from our tombs of addictions, prejudices, sinful habits etc. Let us celebrate Easter with joy of living in freedom with the power of God.

This Wednesday April 7th I am going to Erode, my home town in India to visit my 95-year old Mom. I will return on 7th May. Please pray all may go

well. Fr. Adam SMA will help us run the parish while I am in India.

Trying to Restore Some Freedom to Worship at Easter

Santa Clara, CA: The U.S. Supreme Court rejected Santa Clara County's ban on indoor worship services, ordering California's only holdout to fall in line with the rest of the state following the Court's earlier ruling telling CA that it cannot ban indoor church services because of the coronavirus pandemic. "Banning indoor worship and yet allowing people to gather at airports...and retail shopping is unconstitutional - and the Supreme Court has said so several times," wrote Bishop Oscar Cantu. (1)

British Columbia, Canada: As of February, 2021, there were still no in-person Catholic masses, no worship services, anywhere in the province. Religious leaders are seeking clear guidelines but are losing hope there will be changes to the current policy in time for Easter services. Religious freedom law firms are now beginning legal challenges.

Greece: Christians had defied a government ban and held Epiphany services in January, 2021 and are expected to do this again for Easter. "State orders are one thing and faith is another," said a 38 year-old worshipper. "No law can order us what to do." ⁽²⁾

Scotland: The Scottish Government has revised its lockdown restrictions and said, "should progress suppressing the virus continue," it will permit churches to re-open for communal worship beginning on March 26 with an attendance cap of 50 people (3)

Italy: Unlike some countries, Italy has approved

a fresh round of tight anti-Covid restrictions nationwide to be implemented between March 15 and April 6. The whole country will be at the maximum level of restriction during Easter weekend, April 3-5.




