A reading from the Gospel according to Mark:

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus and said to him,
"Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you."
He replied, "What do you wish me to do for you?"
They answered him, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left."
Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?"
They said to him, "We can."
Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right or at my left is not mine to give but is for those for whom it has been prepared."
When the ten heard this, they became indignant at James and John.
Jesus summoned them and said to them,
"You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Focus Questions:

- 1) Christian leadership is not based upon power and lording it over others. Quite the contrary, it is genuine when expressed in service. Jesus came not to be served but to serve. How are you of service to others?
- 2) The other disciples were indignant at James and John. What do you think is the reason for their indignation?
- 3) The seats requested by James and John carried a bigger burden than they realized. What do we focus on when we do an act of service?

Suggestions for Action:

Say a prayer for the priests of the world to keep the spirit of Jesus alive in their hearts.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Leonard Alan Lauder, an American billionaire, philanthropist, and art collector said once, “When a person with experience meets a person with money, the person with the experience will get the money and the person with the money will get the experience.” We need many things and persons to help live our life. But the experience of life is much bigger than any particular thing or person that supports life.

In today's Gospel a man asked Jesus "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life? The way Jesus answers this question instructs us that life (either present or eternal) cannot be inherited or possessed, bought or sold as a thing. Life is not a commodity that one can buy or sell.

Life is a free gift ready to be freely lived by sharing it as a gift with others. We did not earn it or make it for ourselves. All that we have in possessions, even our own names and relations, is given to us to start our life. We can at the most customize or tailor life to a certain extent according to our taste and convenience. But in no way will we be able to prolong it or change its destiny of death, as we like it. We can do nothing to life and to its nature. Thus life would seem to us pre-destined in time with its limited capabilities and fixed options.



The man in today's Gospel saw life for what it is lacking and unfulfilling and how it is limited and destined. But Jesus portrays how one can break life's limitations and destiny. He instructed the man “Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.” Jesus words “Go and sell” mean that a person who really wants to have life or eternal life has to move from where she/he is stuck.

She/he must be ready to give up (sell) what she/he has. One must sell in order to give to the poor all what one profited from selling.

In short Jesus invites us to see that life consists in moving (not getting stuck in any particular possession, place or policy), in selling (not in possessing and hoarding) and in giving freely to the poor. Such a kind of living would be like saving treasures in Heaven. Treasures in Heaven mean that life will be lived in heavenly currencies providing heavenly goods. Such a kind of life already brings the taste of living the heavenly life during our time on earth.

October is the month of Respect for Life. We pray and promote life at all its stages... from conception to the grave. To understand more fully how to defend and protect human life, we must first consider who we are at the deepest level. God creates us in his image and likeness, which means we are made to be in loving relationship with him. The essence of our identity and worth, the source of our dignity is that we are loved by God: As

St. John Paul II says "We are not the sum of our weaknesses and failures; we are the sum of the Father's love for us and our real capacity to become the image of his Son." May this understanding of our self-identity help us to live the God-in-us. May God help us realize this identity in all stages of life.

October month of Our Lady of the Rosary: “The family that prays together stays together”. The Rosary is a family prayer that all the generations of a family pray together. October is the month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. If your work or other concerns of daily life do not give enough time to pray the full Rosary, please try to come together as a family to pray a decade of the Rosary. A decade of the Rosary is praying an “Our Father”, 10 “Hail Marys” and conclude with “Glory Be”. Also when you wait on line, or are stuck in traffic, or waiting in a doctor's office...



you can raise your heart to God praying the Rosary. In our Church we pray the Rosary every day before Mass.

Rosary App on your phone: You can download from Google play store “Rosary” a free App. It is a great help to pray the Rosary, either a decade or a full Rosary while you drive. Just tune the Rosary app to your car radio and you can join while the Rosary prayer is played.



Happening Now: Tennessee H.S. Football Players Lead Community in Prayer.

Players from two TN football teams led parents and fans in postgame prayer after school administrators banned public religious displays following a complaint from Americans United for Separation of Church and State.

"...the threat of a legal action to forbid prayer after the game was overwhelmed by player led prayer supported by parents and fans in solidarity," said a district alumnus. ⁽¹⁾

"Courts have consistently ruled that prayer and proselytizing cannot be sponsored by schools or school personal," said a school attorney. ⁽²⁾ The school added, "We support the right of students to participate in and lead spontaneous prayers. That right is and will continue to be protected." ⁽³⁾






