Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 22, 2022 Sixth Sunday of Easter Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 Psalm 67: 2-3, 5, 6, 8 Revelation 21: 10-14, 22-23 John 14:23-29

A reading from the Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him.

Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me.

"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you.

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you.

Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me tell you,

'I am going away and I will come back to you.'
If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to
the Father; for the Father is greater than I.
And now I have told you this before it happens,
so that when it happens you may believe."

- 1) Describe a time when you felt the spirit reminding you of Jesus' words.
- 2) Recall a time when you felt at peace.
- 3) Describe a time when you felt the presence of God in your life.

Family and children's question

Talk about a time when you helped someone who felt troubled.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

It was Aunt Sarah's ninety-ninth birthday celebration. Among the guests at her birthday party was her thirty-nine year old pastor. As the pastor was preparing to leave, he said, "Now Aunt Sarah, I hope one year from this very day, I will be able to come and celebrate your one hundredth birthday with you!" Aunt Sarah looked at him for a moment, and then said, "I don't see why not! You look fairly healthy to me." Yes, Aunt Sarah's understanding of her aging was different from that of her pastor.

In today's Gospel we read that Judas leaves Jesus's table of the last supper table, to go to the High Priests, to lead them to Gethsemane in order to betray Jesus. Thus Judas leaving the table means the start of the Passion of Jesus. But Jesus looks at the start of the Passion as the moment of His and God's glorification. Jesus knows that the moments of His Passion, Crucifixion and Death are certainly the most painful and shameful time of His life. But why should Jesus call these moments as those of glorification to Him and to God?

Jesus looks at these shameful and suffering moments from the light of the Resurrection. Jesus knew that the Resurrection will definitely happen to Him. Jesus does not treat the suffering and death as an end in themselves. They are just the way leading Him to His Glory when God will raise Him on the third day. When Jesus foretold about His suffering and death, He expressed that "the Son of Man is about to be delivered into the hands of men, and they will kill him, and he will be raised on the third day." (Matthew 17:22-23).

Jesus underwent His Passion Death and Resurrection as one mystery. According to Jesus there are the moments of a single mystery in which one moment is intrinsically intertwined into the other and all moments; together express the great revelation of God's unconditional love. The Passion, Death and Resurrection are God's great act of giving (offering) His Son for us out of love. "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

For those who follow Jesus's suffering or death iknow that they are not an end in themselves. Suffering leads to new life; "It will be like a woman suffering the pains of labor. When her child is born, her anguish gives way to joy because she has brought a new baby into the world." (John 16:21). For those who believe in Jesus, death opens a new phase, an eternal phase of life, the eternal living with God; "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11:25-26).

Jesus does not annihilate suffering and death. He transforms their intrinsic value. Suffering and death cannot any more break, destroy or stop us forming and living a NEW LIFE. We, the believers have to live through suffering and death, not as their victims but as victors transforming them into eternal LIFE force. As Risen people, who share the power of Resurrection with our Risen Lord, we are victors of suffering and death and transformers of their intrinsic value.

This year 120 teenagers will be confirmed by Bishop Richard Henning on Tuesday May 17th and Wednesday, May 18th at the 5:00 pm Mass. Please pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to come upon them and confirm them to live a faith-filled Christian life of the Catholic Church. Congratulations to all the 120 Confirmation Candidates. We greatly appreciate the selfless service and sharing the gift of faith given by their parents, their Religious Education Teachers, and the Religious Education staff, Mary Ellen, Linda and Joanne.

Good News for Religious Freedom from Supreme Court

The Supreme Court unanimously ruled in a 9-0 vote on May 2, 2022, that the city of Boston, MA, wrongly banned Christian flags from a community flag program in City Hall Plaza and that the city of Boston discriminated against Camp Constitution when it denied its application that referred to a "Christian flag." Justice Stephen Breyer said, "... Boston's refusal to let Camp Constitution raise their flag based on its religious viewpoint 'abridged their freedom of speech". (3)

U.S. Bishops to Send Out Teams of "Preachers"

Sixty Eucharistic preachers have been chosen to share their faith that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist and that He has the power to transform the world. These 60 Eucharistic preachers will form the "front line" of the Churches Eucharistic Revival, a three-year grassroots initiative aimed at increasing devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesu in the Eucharist.
