FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A logging foreman sold a farmer a chainsaw guaranteed to cut down fifty trees in a single day. A week later a very unhappy farmer came to report that the power saw must be faulty – it averaged only three trees a day. The foreman grabbed the saw, pulled the cord, and the saw promptly went, “BZZZZZZZ” The startled farmer demanded, “Hey what’s that noise?” When it is powered the saw can be employed in its full use. But when the powered saw is used as a plain saw it becomes a lot of strain and pain for the user

Today is the Solemn Feast of Pentecost. We celebrate the great event of the Holy Spirit coming down upon the disciples of Jesus. Today is the day when the body of believers was empowered by the power of the Holy Spirit and began to preach and bear witness to the message and presence of Jesus. Today is the birthday of the Church. Today is the day when God the Father sent the believers in Jesus’s name with the power of the Holy Spirit to reconcile and recreate the humanity to be the loving family of God recognizing in all of them God’s loving children.

When we were baptized the Holy Spirit came upon us and made us His Temple. A temple would be an empty structure if God’s living presence does not abide in it. Like wise we too would be just a biological structure existing only to die one day, if we don’t have the Holy Spirit living in us. When we reached the age of reason, we received the Holy Spirit again in the Sacrament of Confirmation, that the Holy Spirit might develop our brain activities step by step from knowledge to understanding, to wisdom, to counsel, to fortitude, to piety, and at last reaching the fear of the Lord. Holy Spirit transforms our natural living into a life in abundance and grace.

In our Parish this weekend is the big time of great celebrations. I thank you all for having been a part of it. Pentecost is God’s gift to everyone of us in order that we serve and love each other with our God-given gift. I thank you that I could serve you as your priest in love and care for the last 10 years here at St. Thomas More and for the last 40 years in various churches in India, Italy, Germany and here in the U.S. A. I also thank all of you who serve in various ministries both in the Sacraments and Social works in and outside of the Church of St. Thomas More. I thank all the volunteers for having arranged various events of our celebration this weekend.

I thank all the members of the St. Thomas More Parish-family for keeping alive and active our Parish-family both in regular and lock-down times with your presence, well-wishes, prayers, care, spiritual and financial support. Pentecost is the right time to lift ourselves in joy and thanksgiving, in celebrations and gratitude. May our Patron, whom we celebrate today, intercede for our families, especially our children to grow in wisdom, strength, and safety. Let us celebrate.



Religious Discrimination Against Fired Flight Attendants

A federal judge ordered that a fired Southwest Airlines flight attendant's lawsuit proceed to trial. When Carleen Carter objected to union officials using union dues to attend a pro-abortion event in Washington D.C. in 2017, she was fired. "What we have here is Southwest Airlines...and the Transport Workers union basically teaming up to thwart the (religious) ideological views of one of their employees," said the president of Right to Work Foundation.⁽¹⁾

Two fired Alaska Airlines flight attendants sued the carrier and the Association of Flight Attendants union, saying they were discriminated against for posting "biblically based" comments to a company message board. They had each questioned the airlines public support for the federal Equality Act, a bill now before Congress, that would remove protections granted under the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA).

The so-called Equality Act is strongly opposed by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) since it would erode religious freedom and enshrine the redefinition of marriage and gender ideology into law.




