



Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

What is Rael Relationship? I m gving you an exmpl: just c ths msg. Evrey Splleing of ths msg is wrong. Bt still you can raed it without aym mistake ... if y want true Raletionship just ignore mistakes... and understand them... Not one of us is perfect. Every one of us has our own blessings and pains, our own weaknesses and strengths. However, to be in a relationship with family or friends has nothing to do with our being perfect or beautiful. All that we need is a heart that can open to the other in love.

Today's first reading narrates the story of a wife and her husband who used to host the Prophet Elisha and his servant Gehazi with food and lodging. One day at their departure after a night's stay, Elisha wanted to do something for them. At the suggestion of his servant the prophet blessed them with the grace of bearing a son. This reading invites us to look at the human birth as not only a physical gift, but also a gift from God.

In the second reading Paul shows us the other dimension of our life. In baptism we are given a new life. We who are baptized into Christ Jesus are baptized into his death. Thus, we are indeed buried with Him through baptism into death, so that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life. While we become a human child of our parents at birth, we become God's Child with newness of life in our baptism. We begin to live for God in Christ Jesus.

Today's Gospel exposes our human life totally to a radical dimension of losing life for Jesus' sake in order to find it. Once we realize that our life is God's gift, freely given to us at our baptism, we will begin to experience the power of Christ's Resurrection in all that we do and say. Such a God-given life will interpret all our relationships radically. We start our human life at birth from our parents. But, with the light of this God-given new life, we are called to live a life that reaches beyond the natural family ties of parents, children, and siblings. The God-given new life will empower us to such an extent that we will be willing to lose anything in order to gain the God-given new life. Outwardly it may look like we are losing life but inwardly we will realize that we are gaining real life, the God-given new life.

If we read today's Gospel in the light of what I explained so far, its radical challenges will sound more like an invitation to dig into one's life for the power of living the God-given new life. Jesus wishes more that we live our life fully well, than that we lose any of our relations in our life. He invites us to see all our relationships more as a God-given gift to gain life than as an obstruction to lose life. The focus of the Gospel is to gain the full life, and our readiness to sacrifice anything that would hinder it. Let us meditate and pray over this Gospel to live our full life well.

His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

Source and Summit

From time to time in this column we'll turn to official documents of the Church to shed a bit more light on the Eucharist. A great place to start is *Lumen Gentium*, the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church. A key document of Vatican II, it was promulgated on November 21, 1964.

The document, like all Church documents, gets its title from the first two words in its primary language (Latin); these words mean "A Light to the nations," and it refers to Jesus. Jesus established the Church and its sacraments. Through the sacraments we have direct contact with Jesus and his love for us. In section 11 of this document, the authors briefly describe each of the seven sacraments and their place in our life. And when it comes to the Eucharist, they wrote, "Taking part in the eucharistic sacrifice [the Mass], the source and summit of the Christian life, [the faithful] offer the divine victim to God, and themselves along with it."

Do we view the Mass and the participation in the Eucharist as the "summit" of our week? If the Mass were a place where we look for entertainment, or where we simply fulfill an obligation, perhaps we wouldn't consider it so. But if we believe in the True Presence, then we realize that we are encountering Jesus himself, and in the most intimate way. No other experience on earth can bring us this close to God, nor

can anything or anyone else bring us true peace. We may go looking elsewhere, but that search is in vain.

Notice that the Eucharist and the Mass is also our "source" of Christian life. We all know that life is difficult, and to truly love means to sacrifice. Who better to strengthen us in our sacrifices than the one who gave his life for all of us, who knows all about suffering, and who accompanies us in our sufferings?

Maybe this week is the week we should reflect on our lives and our priorities. Can we place the Eucharist at the very top of our to-do lists?

How can we better offer ourselves to God and receive the healing touch of our Savior?




Circle of Women




