### John 15:1-8 (Easter 5)

Jesus said to his disciples: "I am the true vine,

and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. 

### Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends.


"Have you heard of a new remedy on the market for baldness? It's made of alum and persimmon juice. It doesn't grow hair, but it shrinks your head to fit what hair you have. "The hair is to beautify and protect the head and not the other way around.

Today's Gospel portrays Jesus as our Shepherd. Jesus is not a hired servant but the true Shepherd. The hired man does not own the sheep and does not care for the sheep as the Shepherd would do. At the time of trouble, the hired man is ready to abandon the flock to save himself while the Shepherd is ready to lay down His life to save His flock as He did on the cross. The hired man uses the flock for his selfish benefit. His relation to his flock is just like cutting the feet (flock) to fit the shoes (his selfish benefit). But Jesus, the true Shepherd, gives His total self so that the sheep might have life and have it more abundantly (John 10:10). Sheep are not for the shepherd but the shepherd is for the sheep.

Let us recall a line from the paschal hymn (found in our missalette) that goes like this, "Agnus redemit oves", which means "The Lamb redeems Sheep". Lamb of God is another image for Jesus. Jesus, the Shepherd has offered Himself as a Lamb to save/redeem the Sheep. St. Paul describes this: "Our Paschal lamb, Christ has been sacrificed. Therefore, let us celebrate the feast." (1 Cor. 5:7).

When God delivered His people from slavery under Pharoah in Egypt, He asked His people to sacrifice a Lamb and smear its blood on the door post of their house. The House that is marked with the blood of the Lamb was saved from the slaughter of the first born and thus started the deliverance from Egypt to the promised Land. Now Jesus is that Passover Lamb killed on the Cross who as a Shepherd saves His sheep through His blood. In Him we can start the journey of liberation from all that enslaves us, to the life in abundance that is offered to us by our Shepherd.

Our Shepherd has become a sacrificing lamb for us, the sheep. He became one of us, a human. He sacrificed Himself for us in order that we may rise from death and live forever like him. The shepherd, the lamb sacrificed himself for us in order that we, the sheep can live with the Shepherd forever. ("The Lamb redeems Sheep" – Agnus redemit oves) Whenever we look at the cross, let us try to recognize the quality of life that the Shepherd wants us to live. We the sheep can live like our Shepherd. We too can become a Lamb of God to promise and promote life to/in other sheep.



### His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

### The Mass: Liturgy of the Eucharist - Part XIV

We are now at the point in the Liturgy of the Eucharist where the Eucharistic Prayer has just ended. We are about to enter into the Communion Rite. The priest sets down the host he has just elevated (as the deacon sets down the chalice). The priest then invites us to pray the Lord's Prayer together. You'll recall that the entire Eucharistic Prayer is directed to God the Father. It is therefore fitting that we all stand, and join together, led by the priest, to continue to pray to the Father, in Jesus' words.

There's an important liturgical note to mention about the Lord's Prayer. During the Lord's Prayer, the priest takes the *orans* posture (hands extended). The posture of the priest and the people is always done for a specific reason. It is the priest who offers the Lord's Prayer on behalf of the people, and the assembly prays through the priest.

After the changes to the liturgy from Vatican II, and the liturgical experimentation that was attempted, the posture of the people during the Lord's Prayer also took

on the orans position. This also led to hands being joined together in some cases. This has continued today. However, from a liturgical perspective, this is incorrect (it is perfectly acceptable in private prayer). Only the priest's hands should extended. The posture of the assembly should be one of hands folded in prayer (if you're unsure about the posture during this part of Mass, just observe your deacon).

In the Lord's Prayer at Mass, we pray in a particular way for the Eucharist (our "daily bread") and also for purification from sin. How remarkable it is, therefore, that the very Lord Jesus who gave us the words of this prayer two

> thousand years ago is truly present, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, in this Eucharist we are about to receive. Praying this prayer and partaking in the Eucharist prepares us for the week ahead.

"Praying the Our Father and *living it* will lead us toward saintliness. The Our Father contains everything: God, ourselves, our neighbors." – *Mother Theresa*

### Liturgical Minister Training-Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

**Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion**: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.




