

Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

Mrs. Jones was standing in her kitchen with her friend. She looked out the window and pointed at the neighbor's wash hanging on the clothesline and said to her friend, "Just look at Mrs. Martin's wash. It sure looks dirty. Look at all those gray streaks on her laundry."

Her friend replied, "Those streaks aren't on your neighbor's wash – they're on your window." If the media through which we see is stained, the vision we get through the media will also be marred.

The seventh Sunday of Easter is in between the feasts of Ascension and Pentecost; it is the time between Jesus's leaving us and the Holy Spirit coming upon us. The Ascension of Jesus means that He goes back to Heaven, leaving His mission to be carried on by us. Pentecost means that He will fill us with His promised gift of the Holy Spirit in order to empower and enlighten us, by His power and wisdom that we may effectively carry on His mission. Thus, this is the time we, the Church, the believers in Jesus Christ prepare ourselves to take up the mission of Jesus with the power and wisdom of the Holy Spirit.

This week's Gospel instructs us how our mission should not be stained by the world. Jesus reminds us that we do not belong to the world any more than Jesus belonged to the world. What does this mean? Jesus does want us to be taken out of the world, but we must keep ourselves from the evil one. In carrying out the mission of Jesus we become the media for Jesus to reach the world. If we, the media is stained by anything other than Jesus's power and wisdom, the mission which reaches the world through us will also be stained.

That His mission through us may witness nothing of this world but everything of God's. Jesus consecrates Himself for us, so that we also may be consecrated in God's truth. Then He sends us into the world as God sent Him to us. In today's Gospel, He prays to God the Father for us saying, "As you sent me into the world, so I sent them into the world. And I consecrate myself for them, so that they also may be consecrated in truth."

Yes, we become the Ambassadors of God sent in the name of Christ to be the living witnesses to the Truth. We are being called by God to live God's message, to proclaim God's truth and to be in the world without belonging to it. Let the Holy Spirit empower us and enlighten us to be Jesus's mission. We, like the media of Jesus proclaim God's truth and Jesus's Good News in all that we say and do. Let us live in the world as witnesses to God's value and Jesus's way of living.

Mother's Day - we wish all Mothers, Grandmothers, Godmothers <u>"Happy Mother's Day"</u>. We appreciate all that you did in bringing up your sons and daughters to life in Christ and for all the care and concern you poured upon your children. In your creative and caring love, we experience every day the shadows of the Love of God himself. May you live long, and may God keep you in good health and cheer of heart. We love you MOMs!

His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

The Mass: Liturgy of the Eucharist - Part XVII

We have reached the last part of our examination of the Liturgy of the Eucharist! Last week, we reviewed what happens right before the distribution of Communion. In this installment, we conclude this major portion of the Mass.

Once Communion has been received by the assembly, the ministers of Communion gather at the altar. The deacon collects all the remaining consecrated hosts and places them into a small number of ciboria. This action reminds us of John 6:12. This is one of the Gospel passages describing the miracle of the multiplication of the fishes and loaves. In that passage, after all had eaten, Jesus said, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So this is

what we do at Mass as well. The assembly is still kneeling at this point, because Jesus remains outside of the tabernacle. The deacon then places those ciboria into the tabernacle, the doors are closed, and the ministers make a sign of reverence (usually bowing or kneeling). The faithful may now sit back in their seats.

The work of the clergy is not yet completed, because the vessels need to be purified. You may have noticed the deacon, in emptying the ciboria at the altar, used a purificator to wipe any fragments of host into one of the chalices. Now water will be poured into the chalices, to mix with those fragments and any Precious Blood that remains. The priest and deacon consume the water, and the chalice is wiped clean with a purificator.

Purification of the vessels takes place because of our belief in the Real Presence. Even the smallest fragment of consecrated host or drop of Precious Blood is still Jesus. We cannot leave Jesus outside of the tabernacle unconsumed.

"The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic spe-



cies subsist. Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ" - Catechism of the Catholic Church. no. 1377

Faith Direct now allows parishioners to opt-in to cover the processing fee for our Parish.





Our National EMMAUS Moment

There are four regional routes, each named after a saint, that are taking place across the country from May 17 - July 16. All routes conclude at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis.On each route, a Eucharistic Procession will take place, as well as events in churches where the Procession makes a stop.

The eastern route is named after St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and begins at St. Mary's Church, the church where Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney was serving when he founded the Knights of Columbus in 1886. This route won't travel through Long Island, but it will be going through Manhattan and Brooklyn.

- The Manhattan portion takes place primarily on Sat. May 25 and Sun. May 26, including stops at St. Patrick's Cathedral and the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton shrine in lower Manhattan. 

Liturgical Minister Training- Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.
