

Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

How does the rainbow happen? When a beam of sunlight comes down to Earth, the light is colorless. Rainbows happen when sunlight penetrates the rain drop in a very specific way. As the colorless beams of sunlight enter a raindrop they separate into the colors of the rainbow. Do you know the Church is the rainbow of God?

This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday. The Greek word 'Pentecost' means 'fifty'. This Sunday is the fiftieth day of Easter Sunday. On this fiftieth (Pentecost) day the disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit. As today's second reading explains that, 'we are all baptized in one SPIRIT and we each have received different kinds of gifts from the same SPIRIT.' God sends the Holy Spirit, who is like the light penetrating us, the raindrops. As the light separate into colors, so the Holy Spirit, the power of God fills us with various gifts. The Church becomes the rainbow of various gifts of the one SPIRIT sent by God.

During the night we see nothing but pitch darkness because there is no light. We need light to see and cherish the colors of the world. It is light that brings the colors to life. Likewise, the Church, without the Holy Spirit is in darkness with nothing to shine on its best colors. The Holy Spirit illumines the Church and shines in its various ministries. Without the HOLY SPIRIT, we the Church will be in darkness. We will stand lifeless and meaningless. With the Holy Spirit empowering and guiding us, we the Church will be witnessing God's power and joy in colors like the rainbow.

Since the Ascension, the last nine days we have prayed to God the Father that the Holy Spirit might come upon us as Jesus has promised us. In this, we are the church of God as body of Christ in the power and guidance of Holy Spirit. Now the Holy Spirit is upon us. Let us lead a life of the Spirit. Let us realize that the power of the Spirit can make us witnesses and testimonies of what God has planned to achieve in us.

Please mark your calendar: June 8th and 9th is our Feast Weekend. From June 1st to 9tha special novena will be prayed for the intentions of all the families of our Parish. At the four masses (5pm on Sat 6/8; 8am, 9:30am, 11:30am on Sun 6/9) we will lift all our families to God's richest blessings.



His Presence Is Real - Reflections on the Eucharist by Deacon Matt

St. Teresa of Ávila

Today is the great feast of Pentecost! It also happens to be the sixth anniversary of my ordination to the diaconate. So I thought this would be an ideal day to take a look at another saint who is strongly associated with the Eucharist, who was greatly inspired by the Holy Spirit and who also happens to be my favorite saint: St. Teresa of Ávila (1515-1584, feast day October 15).

Teresa was a Carmelite nun, a mystic and a contemplative, and a thoughtful writer. She lived in the time of the Protestant revolution sparked by Martin Luther, and others.

One of the most important doctrines she defended was the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, that it is truly and

substantially the Incarnate Son of God. The Protestant argument was that Christ was present only symbolically in the Eucharist, but not in the fullness of his humanity united with his divinity. St. Teresa strongly defended the truth, compelled by the Holy Spirit and her personal experience of the Eucharist, that Jesus acts through the Eucharist by being fully present to give us the strength we need to

deal with the difficulties of life and prepare to be with him eternally in heaven.

It is important to note that because of theological teachings such as this, as well as the spiritual direction she gave in her writings, the Church conferred upon her the important title of Doctor of the Church, a title that only a few theologians have been granted. In fact, she was the first woman recog-

nized in this way, though it took the Church nearly 400 years after her death to do so (by Pope Paul VI in 1970).

St. Teresa, pray for us, that we may be so strongly devoted to the Eucharist as you were!

"Here on earth it's impossible to perform a more meritorious act than visiting Jesus often in the Eucharist. If you took all of the good works done by all of the humans who have ever lived in all of history and stacked them all up and multiplied them by a million, they wouldn't equal the merit, the virtue and the worth of one Mass. The Eucharistic sacrifice is Christ's infinite merit, infinite value." - St. Teresa of Ávila

Did you know...

According to a recent Newsday article, a family of four should have an income of roughly \$100,000 for "basic necessities" on Long Island. SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits are guided by thresholds which include an annual gross income limit of \$45,000 in NY for a family of four.

In Suffolk County 40% of the approximately 80,000 food insecure residents earn above the gross income SNAP threshold in New York.. That threshold is 200% above the poverty line.


Today as we celebrate Pentecost, the Holy Spirit wants to make us advocates of God's presence to bring new life to others, especially those who do not know the love of God in their lives.






Children's Liturgy

You have shown that we are willing to learn and try new things, to experiment with how we pray and evangelize.

There are four regional routes, each named after a saint, that are taking place across the country from May 17 - July 16. All routes conclude at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. On each route, a Eucharistic Procession will take place, as well as events in churches where the Procession makes a stop.

The eastern route is named after St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and begins at St. Mary's Church, the church where Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney was serving when he founded the Knights of Columbus in 1886. This route won't travel through Long Island, but it will be going through Manhattan and Brooklyn.





Liturgical Minister Training-Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.
