From the Pastor

“Doc!” the man screamed, “I’ve lost my memory!”

“Calm down, man. When did this happen?”

The man looked at him. “When did what happen?”

Imagine if only we don’t have the gift of remembering –, believing, trusting, hope and enduring love ... nothing will be possible.

Today is the Solemn Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ This is very well known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi, which means The Body of Christ. This feast originated at the command of Jesus Christ Himself when He asked His disciples on Holy Thursday at the Last Supper with them, “Do this in memory of me.” He took the bread, said the blessings, broke it and shared with His disciples as His Body. Likewise, He gave them the cup filled with wine. He asked them to drink from it the wine as Blood. Then he concluded saying, “Do this in memory of ME.”

From the time of the Apostles, right down to our time as a Church all throughout the days of the church for over two millennium, the church faithfully broke the bread and shared the cup in memory of Jesus. Today’s second reading is from the letter of St. Paul, the Apostle to His Corinthian Church. This letter must have been written between 50 and 55 CE, which is to say as early as 23 years after Jesus’s death and Resurrection.

Paul the Apostle explains to His church what the meaning of the breaking of the bread is and sharing of the cup in His Memory. “Brothers and sisters: The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ?”

When the early and now our church, celebrates the Holy Mass as a liturgical celebration of Sharing the Bread and Wine as a way of fulfilling of Jesus’s command of “Do this in Memory of me”, we don’t do it as a ritual to remember what Jesus did at the Last Supper. We don’t simply reenact or repeat what Jesus did. Rather, we relive and enter into the same mystery of the Last Supper meal. As Paul the Apostle explained we participate in the Body and Blood of Christ.

When we eat food, it gets metabolized within our body. It becomes our flesh and blood. Likewise, when we eat the bread and drink the wine as Christ’s body and blood, they get metabolized in us. Christ’s presence becomes one with us. We become one with Christ. As Paul said, it is no longer we the single individual, but we with Christ Jesus. We become the abode of Jesus Christ. Christ begins to act in and through us. Jesus makes us see as He would see; hear as He hears, feel as He feels, live and witness as He would. Let us pray along with Teresa of Avila:

“Christ has no body but yours, No hands, no feet on earth but yours,
Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassion on this world,
Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good,
Yours are the hands, with which he blesses all the world.
Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, Yours are the eyes, you are his body.
Christ has no body now but yours, No hands, no feet on earth but yours,
Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassion on this world.
Christ has no body now on earth but yours.”

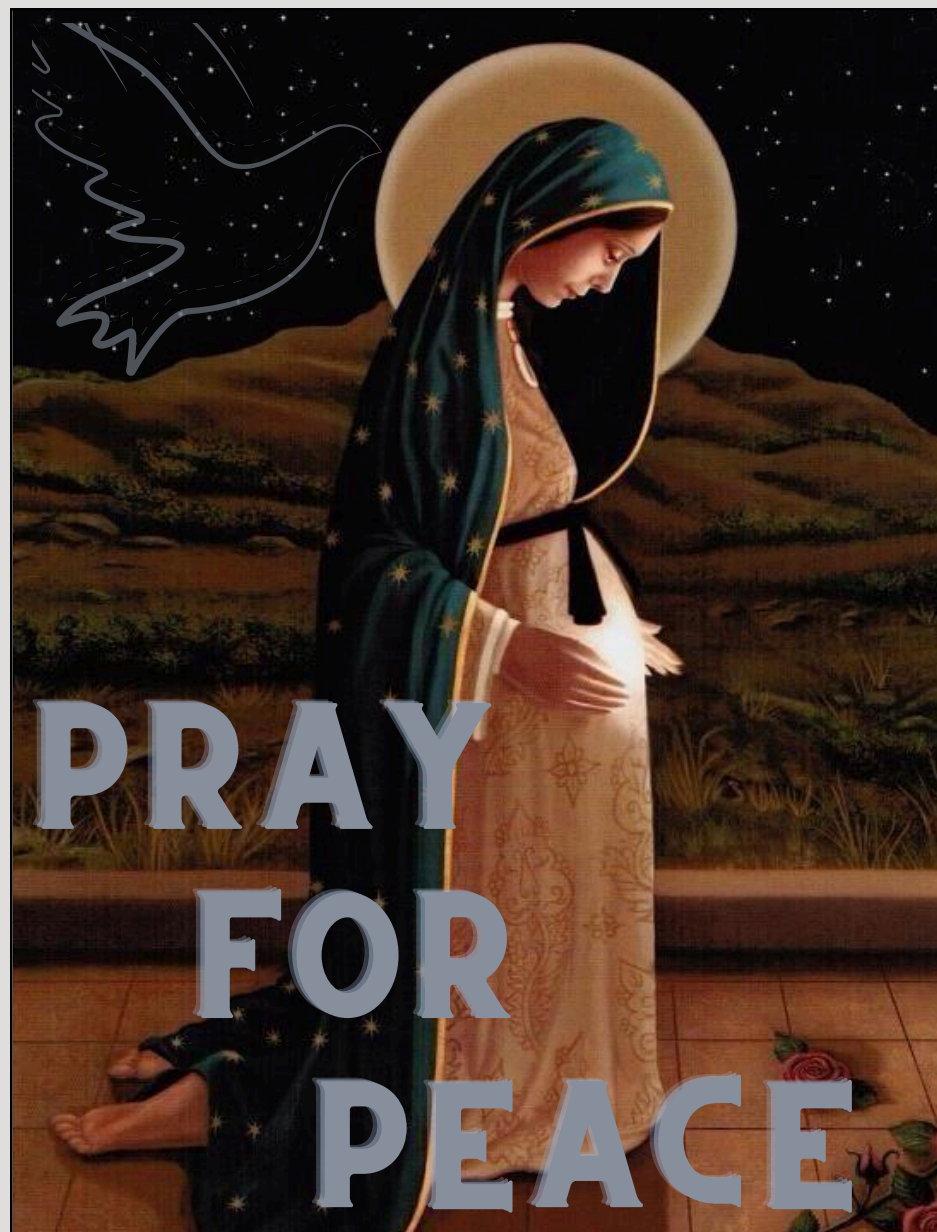

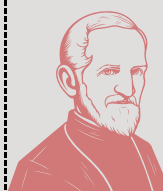
FYI...

A recent Newsday article on SNAP changes and cuts in NY described the effect on thousands of Long Islanders by impacting individual food budgets and straining local resources. New rules require able-bodied adults between the ages of 18 and 64 (without dependents under 14) to work, volunteer, or participate in job training for at least 80 hours a month. It is anticipated that this will result in an increased demand at food pantries, decreased spending at local food stores that rely on SNAP funds for revenue, and an increase in Suffolk County's shared cost burden.
